- noted that this will provide the public an opportunity to address their legislators;
- spoke to the tri-borough meeting that is scheduled for February 23, 2014, at 9 a.m. in Healy;
- stated that Mayor DeVilbiss and Mr. Dyer are not present this evening as they are at the Alaska Municipal League (AML) conference providing presentations regarding the importance of the port development, the rail extension, and the bridge project; and
- related that Assemblymember Beck is going with Mr. Harris, the Borough's state lobbyist, to promote those projects to the State Legislators.

E. CLERK COMMENTS

Ms. McKechnie:

- spoke regarding the upcoming meeting schedule;
- advised that there was a request to schedule a 4 p.m. meeting on March 18 for further discussion regarding the possible economic development corporation; and

Assemblymember Colver objected and opined it would be more appropriate at budget time.

Mr. Moosey:

- stated that the purpose of the meeting is to bring groups together before reports are complete and sent forward; and
- requested that the Assembly consider scheduling the meeting.

VOTE: The motion passed with Assemblymembers Colver, Salmon, and Arvin opposed.

MOTION: Assemblymember Halter moved to strike “4 p.m.” and to insert “5 p.m.” in its place.

VOTE: The motion failed with Assemblymembers Colver, Halter, and Arvin in support.

Ms. McKechnie advised that she will be out of the office March 24 through April 4 and that Ms. Newman will be Acting Clerk in her absence.

Assemblymember Colligan queried the status of the plan for readjusting Assembly boundaries.

Ms. McKechnie:

VIII. VETO (On The Motion To Postpone Indefinitely)

MOTION: Assemblymember Colligan moved to override the mayoral veto on the motion to postpone indefinitely.

VOTE: The motion to override the mayoral veto failed with Assemblymembers Colver, Sykes, and Halter in favor and Assemblymembers Salmon, Colligan, Beck and Arvin opposed.

Ms. Driscoll provided a staff report.

Assemblymember Sykes queried if private citizens would need to have a permit to practice on their own property.

Mr. Strawn:

- related that his interpretation of code is that as long as races are not being held on private property, that they can practice all day long every day;
- stated that as long as there are no contestants that it is not considered a race; and
- read the Webster's Dictionary definition of "contestant."

Discussion ensued regarding:

- the origin of the race track regulations;
- that the legislation does not apply to races conducted on lakes in the winter;
- the benefits associated with clarifying code;
- the desire to not infringe on personal property rights;
- that there is no difference between for profit noise and not for profit noise; and
- the definition of race track.

Deputy Mayor Arvin queried if there was any objection to postponing Ordinance Serial No. 13-144 to a time certain of April 1, 2014.

There was no objection noted.

MOTION: Assemblymember Salmon moved to approve the consent agenda as read into the record by the Clerk.

VOTE: The motion passed without objection.

MOTION: Assemblymember Sykes moved to adopt Resolution Serial No. 14-020.

Assemblymember Sykes requested a staff report.

Ms. Clayton and Mr. Moosey provided a staff report.

Discussion ensued regarding:

- concerns that the required municipal contribution rates could be increased;
- that AML crafted the resolution and encouraged all municipalities to sign on;
- that the State contribution rate continues to increase; and
- that the state employee contribution rate and the municipal employee contribution rate is the same.

MOTION: Assemblymember Colver moved a primary amendment to Resolution Serial No. 14-020, as follows:

- in the title, by striking the words "from constitutional budget reserve fund with" and insert the word "for" after the word "designated" to read: "A resolution of the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly supporting Governor Parnell's proposal for an appropriation designated for use in the state retirement systems, and requesting strong support by the 28th Alaska State Legislature;"
- in the "Therefore Be It Resolved" clause by striking the words "in FY 2015 from the constitutional budget reserve fund" to read: "Therefore be it resolved, that Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly agrees with the Alaska Retirement Management Board and expresses its strong support of the proposal set forth by Governor Parnell for an appropriation to the State retirement systems;"
- in the "Be It Further Resolved" clause by striking the words "from the constitutional budget reserve fund" to read: "Be it further resolved that the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly respectfully requests the 28th Alaska State Legislature to support this proposal strongly and appropriate funds to the State retirement systems;" and

- by inserting a “Be It Resolved” clause that reads: “Be it further resolved that the Matanuska-Susitna Borough Assembly opposes any increase in the required Public Employee Retirement Systems contribution rates by municipalities.”

Assemblymember Sykes spoke in support of the amendment.

VOTE: The primary amendment passed without objection.

Mayor DeVilbiss:

- noted that Governor Parnell intends to cap the contribution rate;
- stated that PERS liabilities will have to start showing in municipal accounts; and
- advised that the language that is being used in Juneau is trust fund rather than systems.

Discussion ensued regarding whether to use trust fund or retirement systems.

MOTION: Assemblymember Colligan moved a primary amendment to Resolution Serial No. 14-020, in the first “Be It Further Resolved” clause, by inserting the words “Public Employees” after the word “state” and by striking the word “systems” and inserting the words “trust fund” in its place.

Mayor DeVilbiss reiterated that the trust fund is the language that is being used in Juneau.

MOTION: Assemblymember Halter called for the question (to stop debate).

VOTE: The motion passed without objection.

VOTE: The primary amendment passed without objection.

VOTE: The main motion passed as amended without objection.

MOTION: Assemblymember Colver moved to adopt AM No. 14-017.

Assemblymember Colver requested that Ms. Bodolay, Assistant Borough Attorney, provide a staff report.

Ms. Bodolay:

- stated that her staff report would consist of the concerns that were outlined in the memorandum that is covered by attorney/client privilege; and
- advised that the body would have to waive attorney/client privilege in order to discuss it in public.

Mr. Aschenbrenner stated that the Assembly would have to waive that privilege as a body by majority vote.

Discussion ensued regarding:

- whether to waive attorney/client privilege;
- the research that has been done to locate a service provider;
- whether the Law Department supports the contract;
- that the memorandum outlines the concerns of the Law Department regarding the contract;
- that the Manager is willing to assume the risks involved as acceptable liability;
- that credit card acceptance will eventually be implemented at additional Borough locations;
- the cost to the Borough to implement acceptance of credit cards; and
- that the contract fees are not negotiable.

VOTE: The motion passed without objection.

XII. MAYOR, ASSEMBLY, AND STAFF COMMENTS

Assemblymember Beck:

- spoke to a medical emergency during his church service last weekend;
- commended emergency responders for the good work that they do;
- expressed concerns that emergency responders are paid less than lifeguards;
- noted his pleasure in the public's participation in the meeting this evening;
- stated his support for non-contiguous local improvement districts; and
- requested that the podium be moved to accommodate the request of the public.

Assemblymember Colver:

- spoke to the State Board of Fisheries meeting last week, which went very well;
- noted the regulatory changes that were made to move fish north; and
- thanked the Commission and staff for their hard work on behalf of the Borough.

Assemblymember Sykes:

- thanked Assemblymember Colver for his hard work with the MSB Fish and Wildlife Commission;
- thanked the public for their participation this evening;
- spoke to two of his neighbors that had a conflict but were able to resolve it themselves;
- stated that he is looking forward to budget time; and
- requested that staff reports be provided for legislation up for public hearing.

Assemblymember Colligan thanked Assemblymember Colver for his work to increase fish populations in the Borough.

Deputy Mayor Arvin:

- stated that he would like emergency responders to know that the concerns they have been raising are being looked at by the Assembly;
- spoke to previous wage increases that have occurred over the last two years;
- noted converting several on-call positions to full time positions is being considered;
- spoke to a vehicle accident at which he was the first person on scene; and
- opined that the current Assembly is sensitive to the need for emergency medical services.

Mayor DeVilbiss:

- thanked the MSB Fish and Wildlife Commission for the good work that they have done;
- spoke to a draft resolution that he intends to bring forward encouraging the state to further develop an access road into the Susitna Basin;
- stated that if there is no objection that he would like to let the State know that the Assembly will be taking action after the comment period expires and submitting input at that time; and
- spoke to having seen Dr. Paramo while in Juneau.

Assemblymember Sykes:

- objected to telling the State that the Assembly will definitely support the draft resolution; and
- stated that he is only comfortable with telling them that the Assembly will be considering it.


Mayor DeVilbiss stated that his intent is only to notify them that the Borough's input will be coming late.
