

Upcoming Assembly Meeting Items:

At the April 6, 2021 regular Assembly meeting, an executive session is scheduled to begin discussions on upcoming employee union negotiations. We will kick-off the proposed fiscal year 2022 budget cycle on April 8, 2021, where staff will provide an overview of the budget and significant changes, and each Department will present results/outcomes from the past year, as well as their goals for the upcoming fiscal year. We are tentatively planning to bring a recommendation forward of land for the Alaska SCTP-YESS, a 501(c)(3) non-profit organization dedicated to promoting youth shooting on a competitive and scholastic level at the April 20, 2021 regular Assembly meeting. Staff are presenting the most likely options to their State Advisor, Neil Moss. The wetland mitigation ordinance will be making its way through the Planning Commission in April and will be coming back to the Assembly on May 18, 2021.

Vaccination Weekly Update:

In the Mat-Su Borough region there have been 13,691 people fully vaccinated. By the state's calculation (population listed at 107,305) they're reporting 12.76% of our population fully vaccinated.





Public Affairs Media Flyover:

Public Affairs will be working to increase sharing of COVID-19 vaccine information. The Borough will utilize our communications channels to support messaging from public health officials to our audiences over the next few weeks.
