The Department of Natural Resources (DNR) concurrent planning process is to:

- 1. Update the Matanuska Valley Moose Range (Moose Range) Management Plan.
- 2. Create a management plan for the Jonesville Public Use Area (JPUA), which is entirely within the Moose Range.

Public involvement is essential to ensure that future actions are not only consistent with the agency mission and the enabling legislation of JPUA and the Moose Range, but also present a shared vision for the future for both. Opioid Settlement Funding Opportunities: The opioid settlement funding that the Borough has received and will receive must be spent on opioid remediation in any of the following areas:

- 1. Primary Prevention
 - a. Training through evidence-based or evidence-informed programs, such as, expanded training for first responders, schools, community support groups, and families
 - b. Prevention of over prescribing and misuse of opioid programs
- 2. Treatment
 - a. Targeted distribution of medications for addiction treatment and integration across the continuum of care
 - b. Targeted screening for treatment
 - c. Connect people who need help to providing organizations
 - d. Address the needs of specific populations, such as criminal justice involved persons, pregnant or parenting women, and their families
- 3. Harm Reduction
 - a. Targeted distribution of Naloxone and other related drugs to prevent overdose deaths and other harms and increase availability of Naloxone
 - b. Training for properly administering Naloxone injections for emergency treatment of an opioid overdose or possible overdose
- 4. Recovery
 - a. Support recovery treatment and support services, such as residential and inpatient treatment, outpatient treatment, therapy and counseling, and recovery housing that allows or integrates medication with support services
 - b. Recovery services including housing for opioid use disorders

As part the of the application and award process of the Human Services Community Matching grant we identified qualifying non-profits that meet the above programs: Set Free Alaska, Boys & Girls Club, Sunshine Community Health Center, Alaska Addiction Rehabilitation Services. In addition, there are a number of non-profit organization listed on the Mat-Su Health Foundation's Connect Mat-Su site that offer services that meet the above criteria as well as other organizations that could qualify for these awards.
