<u>Annual Leachate Hauling Expense Report</u>: Leachate is a product of water that flows through the waste mass. As disposed waste at the Landfill grows, so does the amount of leachate. The larger volumes are generated during snow melt and the rainy season, approximately during 4-6 months of the year. Central Landfill leachate volume has increased from 1.4 million gallons in 2014 to 4.9 million gallons in 2022.

In November of 2021, Central Landfill started hauling its own leachate to Alaska Water and Wastewater Utility (AWWU). Between December 2021 and November 2022, of the 4.9 million gallons of leachate generated, Central Landfill hauled 3.4 million gallons of leachate as compared to 1.5 million gallons hauled by a contractor.

This past year, there were days requiring four trips a day for the MSB tanker and contractor support was used during surge periods where an additional 2-3 trips per day were required. This primarily occurred during two 30-day periods where output exceeded in-house capacity.

The long-term solution to hauling leachate to AWWU is recirculation and evaporation/filtration. A revision to the permit for recirculation is being staffed with DEC and a request for proposals is about to be issued for evaporation/filtration options. Overall, the cost to self-haul is significantly less and saved approximately \$350 per trip or \$217,000 in 2022 for hauling and disposal costs.
