<u>Talkeetna Flooding Update</u>: The Borough recently issued two separate Request for Quotes (RFQs) associated with the emergency repair of the Talkeetna revetment. Purchasing publicly advertised both RFQs and open to all qualified contractors.

On Tuesday, September 19, the Borough received two quotes for roughly 3,000 tons of rip rap. The lowest quote of \$320,000 (Western Construction) will supply and deliver materials to Talkeetna. Western will commence hauling operations on Friday, September 22; they anticipate delivering eight (8) truckloads per day until complete (~10 days). Materials will be stockpiled near the end of Main Street in anticipation of repair activities.

On Wednesday, September 20, Purchasing received six quotes to conduct revetment repair using owner-supplied rip rap. The lowest quote was \$93,750 (Western Construction). This work is scheduled to commence no later than October 3, 2023. Public Works anticipates the emergency repairs to be complete by mid-October. An updated press release will go out on the evening of September 20.

<u>Junk and Trash Free Drop-off Program</u>: The overall program is moving well. Central Landfill has been averaging 682 customers daily since Saturday, September 16. Typically, this time of year, the average is 350 to 400. Big Lake transfer site has received 268 customers, and Talkeetna has received 175 customers. Both transfer sites are exceeding their summertime peak volume of customers per day. We have collected approximately 795 tons of trash, junk, metal, refrigerators, and appliances. We have provided service to over 4,700 customers from all sites.

<u>US Marine Highway Program Grant Award</u>: Senator Murkowski's office informed us the Borough has been selected to receive a grant in the amount of \$944,804 for the Port MacKenzie Rough Terrain Cargo Crane. The total project cost is \$1,181,005, with a 20% match in the amount of \$236,201. This grant is to acquire a 75-ton rough terrain crane for use in loading/unloading cargo, freight, fuel, equipment, and other goods at Port MacKenzie. The crane's versatility will provide needed accommodations for handling heavy freight and cargo at the deep-draft dock, the barge dock, and the bow ramp.
