

Fish & Wildlife Commission Quarterly Report:

The Fish & Wildlife Commission (FWC) met once during the third quarter of 2023 on September 28. Their work on game issues, per RS 21-128, was to discuss planning for their second annual special meeting with ADF&G, and to discuss the most recent game season summary, and other wildlife management issues in the Borough. Tentatively the FWC is considering April of 2024 for this ADF&G special meeting after having their first meeting with ADF&G in June 2023. This timing is preferred given ADF&G's preference and the current preparation for the FWC's work on the upcoming Board of Fisheries Upper Cook Inlet meeting.



<u>Homeowner Snow Communications</u>: The following steps have been or will be implemented to communicate information regarding right-of-way encroachments for snow from private property in preparation for the upcoming winter season:

- On October 3, 2023, the Assembly passed legislation to reduce mailing costs.
- Borough staff have identified target audiences for communications, including residents and business owners (snowplow operators & distributors). Parsed business license data will be used for a targeted letter to snowplow operators.
- The Borough has a snow removal flier showing proper and improper snow removal from private property. This flier will be shared via the following means:
 - Paid social media outreach.
 - Community councils.
 - Post fliers on community bulletin boards.
 - Outreach to equipment sales & rental businesses.
 - Shared via the MSB website.
 - \circ $\;$ Outreach to radio stations to inquire about public service announcements.
- Developed a response plan for Code Compliance.
 - 1st offense Send a letter.
 - 2nd offense Verbal/written warning.
 - 3rd offense Issue citation.

Sex Offender Exclusion Zones: The IT Department has integrated sex offender exclusion zones into the Planning & Land Use Viewer. Among the 227 identified sex offenders in the Borough, 13 currently reside within these exclusion zones and will be eligible for grandfather rights. The Planning Department intends to send letters to all sex offenders residing in the Borough, notifying them of the newly enacted legislation and offering a link to the map displaying the areas where residency is prohibited.
