<u>Talkeetna Sewer and Water Funding Announcement</u>: Senator Lisa Murkowski, a senior member of the Appropriations Committee and Ranking Member of the Interior-Environment Appropriations Subcommittee, announced the Consolidated Appropriations Act 2024. The following funding for the Mat-Su was included in this bill.

- \$5.1 million to replace critical water lines in South Talkeetna
- \$5 million to expand the Upper Susitna Senior Center
- \$500,000 for the Talkeetna Historical Society for rehabilitation and support efforts

Cottonwood Lake Island Access: At the Strategic Planning session on February 17, 2024, Assemblymember Fonov described a situation on Cottonwood Lake where a resident owns one of the two islands on the lake, but he can't get full-time access to his property. He built a home and some vacation cabins on the island, and there is public access to the lake through an MSB-owned boat launch. However, it is only open from 8:00 a.m. to 11:00 p.m. daily. The Borough controls access by hiring a contractor to lock and unlock the gate at the specified times. At the Strategic Planning meeting, it was noted that our Borough code specifies we give access to a public road/land to all residents or none of them. Assemblymember Fonov noted that the Manager has given full-time access to the resident. Unless there is an objection, the Manager will continue to allow the resident access through the Borough gate to his property on the lake.

<u>Saw Crew Project Recognition</u>: Recently, the Assembly approved an appropriation for funding to support the Borough saw crew. This will fund four sawyer jobs in the Borough for one year. When combined with other funding, this should fund sawyer operations for wildfire mitigation through 2026. The Saw Crew Project is a year-round fuel reduction crew comprised of four individuals

who have been working across the Borough at various locations. Our Borough Natural Resource Manager, Emerson Krueger, has provided the vision and secured external funding. Kudos to Emerson and the saw crew.
