<u>Wolf Lake Park Update</u>: The Borough Public Works and Community Development Departments recently met with the Alaska Department of Natural Resources (DNR) to discuss potential public access opportunities for the east end of Wolf Lake. DNR is currently in the exploratory phase of a proposed development in the area and recently presented a conceptual design to the Northern Lakes Community Council as part of their community outreach efforts.

The Borough's Public Works Department is closely monitoring the proposed development, particularly due to its connection with the future development of North Engstrom Road. Coordination between the Borough and DNR will continue, with additional meetings planned to evaluate potential design options and collaborative opportunities. Further updates will be provided as DNR advances through its deliberative planning phase.

<u>Sutton Story Book Trail</u>: The Sutton community is excited to celebrate the grand opening of the Sutton Story Book Trail, a delightful new pathway connecting the Sutton Library to Alpine Historical Park. This innovative trail was a community-nominated CIP project for FY25 and was proudly completed in-house by the Community Development Department, showcasing local dedication and teamwork. Thanks to grant funding from the Friends of the Sutton Library, vibrant story panels have been installed along the trail, creating a fun and engaging experience for readers of all ages. The Borough Trails team cleared the trees, built the trail tread, and installed proper drainage to complete the trail. The Sutton Story Book Trail is a blend of literacy and outdoor adventure and offers visitors a safe way to explore and enjoy two of Sutton's community spaces.
