### VI. BOROUGH STAFF REPORTS

 A. Mr. Hugh Leslie received contact from a member of the board yesterday about borough employees being bullied and harassed. Hugh clarified that since the property is owned by the taxpayers, they try to deescalate and diffuse the situation before it gets to the point where employees feel that their safety is in jeopardy. When it gets to the point that the staff member feels threatened, they can ask the person to leave and call 911. The staff member is then encouraged to get in touch with Hugh. In the past, there has been a patron banned from the library for one year because of harassment and inappropriate behaviors in the library and on the library property. He stated that the goal is to keep employees from feeling like they don't want to go to work because of intimidation. In the case of objectionable materials, there is a process in place to address that.

Member Fischer asked for the best way to copy the library board on letters being sent to the assembly. Hugh said to send them to him and he would send them out to the board members.

#### B. Librarians

Zane Treesh from Wasilla. 23,000 circ last month. The temporary sub pool just closed and they are looking to hire somebody. Kids programming to start up in the 3<sup>rd</sup> week of September. Friends of Library had a book Super Sale Fundraiser and raised \$1,800. Jeanie said they keep the children's books; others are sent to used book stores, thrift stores, and Bright Lights. About 100 boxes of books are left over. The funds raised will go for Friends of the Library items and programming needs. In the past, funds have paid for disc resurfacer and a paperback glue binding machine. They are continuing their unaccompanied minor policy and it is helping to reduce chaos in the library. Fire alarms were tested over the past 3 weeks and are in good working order.

Beth Skow from Palmer. Wolf Architect will be meeting next week at the Palmer Depot. Alaska Demolition is doing the demo. There is nothing to be salvaged.

Juli Buzby from Sutton. School year programming is starting. Teens started off last week with painting. They meet at least once/week during the school year and they organize at least one community event each month; next week, they are holding a Community Movie Night. This week, the after school program starts weekly on Thursdays. Homeschooling program starts next week. Threads and Book Club are beginning. They are hoping for a concert this fall.

Geri Denkewalter reported for Talkeetna. Breakfast Book Club starts tomorrow. They are working on a family group who are attempting to read 1,000 books before Thanksgiving. Friends of the Library celebrated their 50<sup>th</sup> anniversary with a quilt give-away, Art in the Park, and an ice cream social. They are starting Stone Soup. They are doing some passive programming this year and a Saturday Game Day. Talkeetna is experiencing flood damage and the library is trying to help keep people warm and dry.

Julie Mitchell from Willow. Storytime started last week. The Library Association's mentoring program will be up and running in a few weeks. The first Get to Know Your Community seminar series is October 21. Cantora Arctica is coming September 17. Willow Trails Challenge is ending on September 17; the library is the place where people come to have their passports stamped Winter Trails Challenge will begin late November. The first movie night in 18 months will be September 22, Super Mario Bros. Last Friday, the Lion's Club donated an enlarging machine to the library.

Cassidy Drake from Big Lake. Cassidy is back to work part-time since surgery. Starting STEAM and Story Fun next week. STEAM was moved from Tuesdays to Thursdays. Movie night will happen later this month. They are going to start back up their Flashlight Reader Program around Halloween.

Marita Crosby from Trapper Creek. Two more homeschool kids were added to the program for a total of 11 students. After school program begins Wednesday. Both programs are focusing on an aviation theme.

VII. PERSONS TO BE HEARD/AUDIENCE PARTICIPATION – 3 minutes per person.
 Jeanie, Friends of Wasilla Library Member, announced Heather Lende, Alaska's Writer
 Laureate, will be in the area October 3-4, and she passed out flyers to everyone at the meeting.
 On October 3, Lende will be at the Wasilla Senior Center talking about obituary writing during
 the day, and work with some Wasilla High School Students. That evening, she will do a
 reading and answer questions at the Wasilla Library from 5:30-7pm. She will attend a reception
 and lead a writing workshop in Talkeetna.

### VIII. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

#### A. Palmer Library

Vice Chair Pougher encouraged that the best way to help the Palmer Library is to spread positive information about libraries. She asked for a board member to put something in the newspaper about what libraries have to offer. Friends of the Palmer Library are working on a Big Cabbage Radio interview to talk about libraries before the bond election on October 2.

Member Kincaid questioned what the procedure is to get that information to the paper. Hugh responded that we, as individual board members, can write letters to whomever and identify as a board member. The board, as an entity, can also write a letter, provided that it is an agenda item before it is sent to publication. At this point, there is not time to have the letter reviewed by the board, as a whole, before the election. As a citizen, you can also write a letter.

IX.	NEW BUSINESS				
	A. Challenged Materials Review Process.				
	Secretary Kysar suggested that verbiage be added to the Challenged Materials Policy that the				
	challenger needs to have read the book. Hugh explained that any change to that policy would				
	need to be approved by the Borough Attorney, the Borough Manager, and the Community				
	Development Director.				
	Member Fischer expressed concern that changing the policy too often would hurt the Library				
	Board's credibility, and that the Review Committee members can ask that question during the				
	public meeting. Vice Chair Pougher agreed since there was a change made in February.				
	Chairperson Knazovich and Secretary Kysar both expressed the importance of having the				
	person who wishes to challenge a book personally attest to having read the book in its entirety.				
	Secretary Kysar motioned that a discussion be opened on the topic, and it was seconded by				
	Member Fischer. Member Fischer suggested that the question be asked by a committee				
	member during the Challenged Materials Review meeting.				
	Member Kincaid suggested that some people may not be able to emotionally handle the				
	content of the book in question and so should not be held accountable for reading the book				
	before challenging it. She suggested that, as a way to combat the image problem that libraries				
	currently have, the community should all be brought in to make their opinions heard regarding				
	the book, not just librarians and members of the board.				
	Palmer Librarian Skow explained that the committee is made up of members who know what				
	the freedom to read is and understand the Bill of Rights.				
	Wasilla Librarian Treesh added that the federal statute on obscenity states that you have to				
	take the work as a whole, so if the patron has not read the entire book, they can't challenge it				
	based on what the law says.				
	Willow Librarian Julie Mitchell read a line from the Reconsideration Policy, "I have examined				
	(all) (part) (none) of this title." She pointed out that the patron is asked, when they fill out the				
	reconsideration form, if they have read the book.				
	Chairperson Knazovich called the question to a vote. Those in favor were Chairperson				
	Knazovich and Secretary Kysar. Those who voted against the change were Vice Chair				
	Pougher, Member Robson, Member Kincaid, and Member Sweetman.
