From Robert's Rules of Order Newly Revised, 12th edition

§48. MINUTES AND REPORTS OF OFFICERS

Minutes

48:1 *The official record of the proceedings of a deliberative assembly is usually called the minutes, or sometimes—particularly in legislative bodies—the journal. The minutes should be kept in a substantial book or binder.*

48:2 Content of the Minutes. In an ordinary society, *the minutes should contain mainly a record of what was done at the meeting, not what was said by the members.* The minutes must never reflect the secretary's opinion, favorable or otherwise, on anything said or done.

48:3 To modify the rules governing what is regularly to be included in the minutes requires adoption of a special rule of order, although a majority vote may direct the inclusion of specific additional information in the minutes of a particular meeting.

48:4 The first paragraph of the minutes *should contain the following information* (which need not, however, be divided into numbered or separated items directly corresponding to those below): 1) *the kind of meeting: regular, special, adjourned regular, or adjourned special; 2) the name of the society or assembly; 3) the date and time of the meeting, and the place, if it is not always the same; 4) the fact that the regular chairman and secretary were present or, in their absence, the names of the persons who substituted for them; and 5) whether the minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved—as read, or as corrected—and the date of that meeting if it was other than a regular business meeting.* Any correction approved by the assembly is made in the text of the minutes being approved; the minutes of the meeting making the correction merely state that the minutes were approved “as corrected,” without specifying what the correction was (see first paragraph of form, 48:8). *The body of the minutes should contain a separate paragraph for each subject matter, and should show: 6) all main motions (10) or motions to bring a main question again before the assembly (6:25–27; 34–37) that were made or taken up—except, normally, any that were withdrawn³—stating: a) the wording in which each motion was adopted or otherwise disposed of (with the facts as to whether the motion may have been debated or amended before disposition being mentioned only parenthetically); and b) the disposition of the motion, including—if it was temporarily disposed of (9:7–11, 38:8)—any primary and secondary amendments and all adhering secondary motions that were then pending; 7) secondary motions that were not lost or withdrawn, in cases where it is necessary to record them for completeness or clarity—for example, motions to Recess or to Fix the Time to Which to Adjourn (among the privileged motions), or motions to Suspend the Rules or grant a Request to Be Excused from a Duty (among the incidental motions), generally only alluding to the adoption of such motions, however, as “... the matter having been advanced in the agenda on motion of...” or “... a ballot vote having been ordered, the tellers...”; 8) the complete substance of oral committee reports that are permitted to be given in small assemblies in particular cases as provided in 51:60–62; 9) all notices of motions (10:44–51); 10) all points of order and appeals, whether sustained or lost, together with the reasons given by the chair for his or her ruling; and 11) the declaration by the chair in “naming” an offending member as a part of disciplinary procedures, as well as any disorderly words that led to such naming and that the*

chair directed the secretary to take down (see 61:12–14). The last paragraph should state: 12) the hour of adjournment.

48:5 *Additional rules and practices relating to the content of the minutes are the following: 1) The name of the maker of a main motion should be entered in the minutes, but the name of the seconder should not be entered unless ordered by the assembly. 2) a) When a count has been ordered, the number of votes on each side is entered, unless the vote was on a motion that would not otherwise be entered in the minutes. b) When the voting is by ballot, the full tellers' report (45:37–40) is entered. c) When the voting is by roll call, the names of those voting on each side and those answering "present," as well as the total number in each category, are entered. If members who are present fail to respond on a roll-call vote, enough of their names must be recorded as present to reflect that a quorum was present at the time of the vote. If the chair voted, no special mention of this fact is made in the minutes. 3) The proceedings of a committee of the whole, or a quasi committee of the whole, are not entered in the minutes, but the fact that the assembly went into committee of the whole (or into quasi committee) and the committee report is recorded (see 52). 4) When a question is considered informally, the same information is recorded as under the regular rules, since the only informality in the proceedings is in the debate. 5) When a committee report is of great importance or should be recorded to show the legislative history of a measure, the assembly can order it "to be entered in the minutes," in which case the secretary copies it in full in, or attaches a copy of it to, the minutes. 6) The name and subject of a guest speaker can be given, but no effort should be made to summarize his remarks.*

48:6 *The use by the secretary of a recording device can be of great benefit in preparing the minutes, but a transcription from it should never be used as the minutes themselves.*

- 48:7 The Signature. Minutes should be signed by the secretary and can also be signed, if the assembly wishes, by the president. The words Respectfully submitted—although occasionally used—represent an older practice that is not essential in signing the minutes.

FY 2026–2030

Introduction

Public libraries across the Matanuska-Susitna Borough are foundational to informed communities, educational development, and civic engagement. The Borough libraries are managed by dedicated staff that seek to optimize the collection, programs and events. They serve as support centers for parents, safe havens for youth, community hubs, and catalysts for job readiness and personal growth. This plan honors the legacy of elected officials, community members and library advocates that have prioritized library investment over the decades. It celebrates community involvement and outlines a forward-looking strategy to guide library operations through 2030.

SWOT Analysis Summary

The following is a high-level summary of the collective strengths, weaknesses, opportunities, and threats identified from the Big Lake, Sutton, Talkeetna, Trapper Creek, and Willow Public Libraries.

Strengths

- Friendly, welcoming, and resourceful staff
- Strong sense of community ownership and support
- Free Wi-Fi and access to books, DVDs, and interlibrary loans
- Engaged volunteers and Friends of the Library groups and advocates
- Programs and events for all age groups

Weaknesses

- Space constraints: limited seating, shelving, and staff areas
- Limited open hours, especially during peak demand times
- Two of the libraries have aging infrastructure
- Low teen engagement and lack of designated spaces for young adults
- Conflicts or limitations due to shared facility management

Opportunities

- Expand community learning: adult education, homesteading, crafts, home skills and health programs
- Create a “Library of Things” (tools, puzzles, outdoor gear) and learning kits
- Use rotating programming and shared resources across the library network
- Add digital subscriptions, more AV tools, and improved public computers
- Update the Library Collection Development Policy to align with community values, including parent choice, intellectual freedom, and youth protection
- Promote library card registration and the benefits

- Cooperative programming with other organizations and businesses in the community.
- Partner with Alaska’s Joint Library Network to provide family notifications when minors check out materials and to support direct communication to cardholders about library events, programs and news
- Enhance discovery and access to Artificial Intelligence including reimagining service delivery, streamlining operations and enriching patron experience.

Threats

- Funding reductions or unstable grant funding limiting services and staffing
- Security concerns for staff due to limited law enforcement presence or aggressive patrons
- Maintenance issues left unresolved due to facility ownership or shared space limitations
- Differences in community values may lead to conflicts over whether the library's collections appropriately represent the diversity of perspectives and interests within the community.

Goal 1: Increase Library Patronage

Objectives

1. Strengthen Community Engagement
 - Host speaker series, book clubs, teen activities, music events, and culturally relevant programs.
 - Enhance outreach to homeschool families with curriculum-aligned resources and programming.
2. Enhance Accessibility
 - Extend operating hours, particularly on weekends and during summer months.
 - Address transportation-related barriers through partnerships for mobile or delivery services, especially in Talkeetna and Trapper Creek.
3. Modernize Communication
 - Implement email newsletters, social media updates, and interactive websites.

- Post calendars and announcements online, on social media, and in physical community spaces.
4. Deepen Community Partnerships
 - Strengthen connections with schools, senior centers, youth organizations, and local businesses.
 - Invite volunteers to lead storytimes, workshops, and skill-sharing sessions.

Goal 2: Ensure Physical Safety of Patrons and Staff

Objectives

1. Improve Interior and Exterior Security
 - Install security cameras and train staff on monitoring and review.
 - Design clearer emergency exits and establish visible protocols.
2. Establish a Borough-Wide Safety Standard
 - Develop and implement consistent emergency and intruder response protocols.
 - Provide regular staff training on safety, crisis response, and de-escalation techniques.
3. Address Site-Specific Concerns
 - Evaluate and improve outdoor areas, such as shaded seating in Sutton, pedestrian path in Talkeetna and parking arrangements in Trapper Creek.
4. Improve Shared-Space Coordination
 - Address and resolve conflicts arising from shared facility usage.

Goal 3: Provide Expanded Services and Programming

Objectives

1. Expand Programs for All Ages
 - Offer adult education in digital literacy, genealogy, wellness, homesteading, and crafts.
 - Increase the number of teen and young adult offerings with structured social and learning opportunities.

2. Create Specialized Lending Services

- Launch “Library of Things” collections (e.g., tools, tech devices, outdoor gear, crafting supplies).
- Provide lending kits for STEAM learning, gardening, and home-based education.

3. Enrich Youth Services

- Expand early literacy and sensory-friendly materials.
- Increase after-school programming, including mobile and digital delivery in remote areas.

4. Maximize Use of Physical Spaces

- Explore enclosing the Sutton patio.
- Add outdoor storage at Big Lake to free up interior space.
- Organize indoor storage at Willow for more efficiency.
- Evaluate and reconfigure training room in Trapper Creek to provide more program space including addressing storage space.

Goal 4: Keep Pace with Technological Needs and Advancements

Objectives

1. Improve Public Access to Technology

- Increase public computer availability in high-use libraries like Talkeetna and Big Lake by adding additional laptops or tablets.
- Provide tablets for children and adaptive devices for individuals to create better equal access.

2. Adopt Innovative Library Tools

- Subscribe to digital platforms for eBooks, audiobooks, and streaming.
- Explore AI-powered systems for process improvement and patron engagement.

3. Enhance Digital Offerings

- Maintain and enhance free public Wi-Fi, particularly in underserved areas like Trapper Creek.
- Explore lending mobile hotspots and outdoor Wi-Fi extensions.

4. Collaborate Across Libraries

- Use cloud-based platforms to develop shared programming kits, coordinate grant efforts, and manage regional learning tools.

Strategic Results

1. Increased community awareness, engagement, and use of library services
2. Safe, welcoming environments for all patrons and staff
3. Robust and relevant programming that reflects community interests and needs
4. Expanded digital services and access to technology

3 **distribution of indecent material to minors."**

4 **BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF ALASKA:**

5 *** Section 1.** AS 11.41.452 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

6 (f) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under this section that, at the
7 time of the offense, the defendant was acting in the course of employment as an
8 employee or official of a school, museum, or public library.

9 *** Sec. 2.** AS 11.51.130 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

10 (c) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under this section that, at the
11 time of the offense, the defendant was acting in the course of employment as an
12 employee or official of a school, museum, or public library.

13 *** Sec. 3.** AS 11.61.128 is amended by adding a new subsection to read:

14 (f) It is an affirmative defense to a prosecution under this section that, at the

1 time of the offense, the defendant was acting in the course of employment as an
 2 employee or official of a school, museum, or public library.

3 * **Sec. 4.** AS 14.56 is amended by adding new sections to read:

4 **Article 7. Access to Library Material.**

5 **Sec. 14.56.450. Public library material policy.** (a) A librarian employed by a
 6 public library may curate library material for inclusion in the public library according
 7 to the policy approved by the governing body of the public library.

8 (b) The commissioner shall establish and update as necessary a model policy
 9 on the curation and reconsideration of library material within a public library. The
 10 policy must provide standards for the selection and curation of library material,
 11 establish criteria for the removal of existing library material, and provide protection
 12 against attempts to censor library material. At a minimum, the policy must

13 (1) recognize that a public library serves as a center for voluntary
 14 inquiry and the dissemination of information and is the marketplace of ideas;

15 (2) promote the free expression of, and free access to, ideas by
 16 prohibiting the censorship of library material;

17 (3) prohibit the removal of library material from a public library based
 18 on the origin of, background of, or views expressed by the library material or of those
 19 contributing to its creation;

8 not challenge library material based on selective passages that are taken out of

11 subject to reconsideration may not be removed from its location within the
12 public library and must remain available for a patron to reserve, check out, or
13 access;

14 (D) require that at least one librarian employed at the public
15 library where the request was submitted formally participate in the review

17 (E) provide a process by which an individual can appeal a
18 decision made on reconsideration, using the standards set out in (5)(A) - (E) of

30 religious or political views, prohibit the public library from acquiring, maintaining, or
31 displaying a specific work or subject matter, restrict access or searchability of library

1 material, or require parental permission for a minor to access library material.

2 (e) The governing body of a public library may not, based on objections to
3 sexual content, prohibit the public library from acquiring, maintaining, or displaying a
4 specific work or subject matter, restrict access or searchability of library material, or
5 require parental permission for a minor to access library material unless, with respect
6 to the specific population to which the library material is made available,

7 (1) the average person, applying contemporary community standards,
8 would find the library material, taken as a whole, appeals to the prurient interest;

9 (2) the library material depicts or describes, in a patently offensive
10 way, sexual conduct defined by AS 11.66.150; and

11 (3) the library material, taken as a whole, lacks serious literary, artistic,
12 political, or scientific value.

13 (f) A government entity that exercises authority over the purchase, selection,
14 curation, and location of library material at the state or municipal level may not reduce
15 funding for a public library because of the public library's compliance with this

19 **Sec. 14.56.455. School library material policy.** (a) A librarian employed at a
20 school library may select, purchase, and acquire library material for inclusion in the
21 school library according to the policy approved by the governing body of the school

24 on the curation and reconsideration of library material within a school library. The
25 policy must provide standards for the selection and curation of library material,
26 establish criteria for the removal of existing library material, and provide protection
27 against attempts to censor library material. At a minimum, the policy must

28 (1) recognize that library material is provided for the interest,
29 information, and enlightenment of all students and should present a wide range of
30 points of view in the collection;

28 (B) require that an individual submitting a request for a school
29 library to reconsider library material review the library material as a whole and
30 not challenge library material based on selective passages that are taken out of
31 context;

1 (C) provide that, during the review process, the library material
 2 subject to reconsideration may not be removed from its location within the
 3 library and must remain available for students to reserve, check out, or access;

4 (D) require that at least one school librarian employed at the
 5 school and professionally trained to a level determined by the school district
 6 formally participate in the review process; and

7 (E) provide a process by which an individual can appeal a
 8 decision made on reconsideration, using the standards set out in (6)(A) - (E) of
 9 this subsection.

10 (c) A school board shall adopt the model policy established by the
 11 commissioner under (b) of this section, as well as any updates to the model policy. A

 16 those contributing to its creation. The school board may not, based on disagreement

 18 depiction of race, gender, sexuality, or religious or political views, prohibit a school
 19 library from acquiring, maintaining, or displaying a specific work or subject matter,
 20 restrict access or searchability of library material, or require parental permission for a
 21 minor to access library material.

22 (e) An employee of a school library is immune from civil and criminal
 23 liability arising from good faith actions performed under this section.

24 **Sec. 14.56.460. Private right of action.** (a) A government entity that exercises
 25 authority over the purchase, selection, curation, and location of library material at the
 26 state or local level may not

27 (1) censor or order another person to censor library material; or

28 (2) impose discipline, threaten to impose discipline, or terminate a
 29 school or library employee for refusing to censor library material.

30 (b) A school or library employee may bring an action in a court of competent
 31 jurisdiction for damages, including punitive damages, and for declaratory and

1 injunctive relief and other remedies as may be appropriate against a government entity
 2 that violates (a)(2) of this section by disciplining, terminating, or threatening to
 3 discipline or terminate the librarian for the librarian's refusal to censor library material.

4 (c) A student, or the student's parent or guardian, may bring an action in a
 5 court of competent jurisdiction for declaratory and injunctive relief and for damages
 6 against a government entity that violates (a)(1) of this section by censoring or ordering
 7 another person to censor library material within a school attended by the student.
 8 Damages shall be awarded at a minimum of \$451, but not more than \$1,451, for each
 9 censored work.

10 (d) An author, bookseller, or publisher may bring an action in a court of
 11 competent jurisdiction for declaratory and injunctive relief and for damages against a
 12 government entity that violates (a)(1) of this section by censoring or ordering another
 13 person to censor library material written, sold, or published by the author, bookseller,
 14 or publisher. Damages shall be awarded at a minimum of \$451, but not more than
 15 \$1,451, for each censored work.

16 (e) In an action under this section, the court shall grant a prevailing plaintiff
 17 reasonable attorney fees and costs, including expert witness fees.

18 (f) A government entity may not use funds that would otherwise have been
 19 appropriated or allocated to a library to pay damages, attorney fees, or other related
 20 costs.

21 (g) It is an affirmative defense to an action brought under this section that, at
 22 the time of the conduct giving rise to the action, the government actor or member of
 23 the government was acting under direct compulsion from binding state or federal
 24 government authority.

25 (h) An action to enforce this section must be commenced within three years
 26 after the date on which the violation of this section occurred.

27 **Sec. 14.56.465. Definitions.** In AS 14.56.450 - 14.56.465,

28 (1) "block" means to prohibit the acquiring, maintaining, or displaying
 29 of a specific work or subject matter, restricting access to or searchability of works, or
 30 to require parental permission to access works;

31 (2) "censor" means to block library material based on disagreement

1 with the ideas or concepts expressed by the material, or based on objections to sexual
2 content, without having made a finding that, with respect to the specific population to
3 which the material is made available,

4 (A) the average person, applying contemporary community
5 standards, would find the library material, taken as a whole, appeals to the
6 prurient interest;

7 (B) the library material depicts or describes, in a patently
8 offensive way, sexual conduct defined by AS 11.66.150; and

9 (C) the library material, taken as a whole, lacks serious literary,
10 artistic, political, or scientific value;

11 (3) "librarian" means an employee who is trained as required by the
12 employer and who is responsible for the purchase, selection, curation, removal, and
13 display of library material;

14 (4) "library material" means a book, video, subscription or locally
15 curated database, periodical, chart, graph, movie, game, map, interactive application
16 and software, other enrichment or entertainment material, and, for a school library,
17 other material not required as part of classroom instruction, in a printed or electronic
18 format belonging to, on loan to, or otherwise in the custody of a public library or
19 school library;

20 (5) "public library" means a library established under AS 14.56.400;

21 (6) "reconsider" means to reclassify, move to a different section of the
22 library, or remove from the library an item in the library's collection.
